TEST SITE: Bring water, shade and shelter for you and your dogs. There will be *no* food services on site, please bring your own lunch.

These tests will run **rain or shine**. All dogs must be under control, on a leash except during their test. A \$10 penalty will be levied if your dog is off leash and runs onto the course.

Dogs may run "naked" or wear a snug fitting "catch" collar as long as there is nothing on it that can become entangled in the line. **Prongs, Ecollars and Flexis are** *not* **permitted on the course. No open toed shoes allowed on the field.**

GENERAL INFORMATION AND TEST RULES

ELIGIBILITY: Purebred or mixed-breed dogs must be at least 12 months of age that:

- (a) Are individually registered with the CKC (have a CKC registration number),
- (b) Have an Event Registration Number (ERN),
- (c) Have a Performance Event Number (PEN),
- (d) Are eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- (e) Have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed
- (f) Have a Canine Companion number (CCN) if it is a mixed-breed

ENTRY LIMIT: Entries will be limited to 45 runs per CAP test and 80 for Sprinters.

2 Chase Ability Program (CAP) Tests

BITCHES IN SEASON: New Sprinter rule 2.4.4 Females in season must wear clean, dry, snugly fitting panties specifically designed for the purpose of preventing/containing discharge. Females in season will be scheduled at the end of each event or as the club deems appropriate. *NO Bitches in Season for CAP*

WHAT IS THE CHASE ABILITY PROGRAM (CAP) TEST?

This exciting event, developed after the ever-popular Lure Coursing, allows dogs to uncover their natural prey drive through chasing a lure - all while having lots of fun. The Chase Ability Test also provides purebreds and mixed-breeds with the opportunity to compete and earn multiple titles and certificates in a field event that all dogs are capable of performing. Two types of courses will be available: one for dogs shorter than 12 inches at the withers or brachycephalic dogs and another course for the remainder of the dogs entered. The Chase Ability program is a pass/fail event. How does your Dog earn a Pass? A dog must run alone, chasing the lure and complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption

ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS

Chase Ability Program participation is open to all purebred and mixed-breed dogs at least 12 months of age that are:

- individually registered with the CKC, or
- have an Event Registration Number (ERN), or
- have a Performance Event Number (PEN), or
- are eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed, or
- have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) if it's a mixed breed.
- have a Temporary Competition Number (TCN)

The CAP is an athletic pursuit that requires your dog to be in very good condition. Your dog relies on you to ensure this.

Females in season may not compete.

If in the opinion of the Test Committee, any entry is found to be lame, unfit to compete or a female in season, it shall not be allowed to compete and the entry fees shall be refunded.

TITLES

There are three titles dogs may earn doing the Chase Ability Program. They are:

Chase Ability (CA) OR Veterans Chase Ability (VCA)

awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability event three times under at least two different judges

Chase Ability Excellent (CAX) OR Veterans Chase Ability Excellent (VCAX)

awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability event a total of then times (CA + 7 additional passes)

Chase Ability Excellent 2 (CAX 2) OR Veterans Chase Ability Excellent 2 (VCAX 2)

awarded to a dog that passes the Chase Ability event a total of 20 times (CAX + 10). For every further 10 passes the dog may add a higher number after the CAX (CAX 3, CAX 4, etc.)

COURSE LENGTHS OFFERED

300 yards: For dogs shorter than 12 inches at the withers and/or brachycephalic (flat-faced) dogs.

600 yards: For all dogs not eligible to run the short distance.

NEWVeteran dogs (7yrs old and older on date of the event) shall run half of the regular course for their height category, or they can continue to run the regular length.

AWARDS

A qualifying flat ribbon will be awarded to each dog that achieves a Pass grade.

A Rosette will be awarded to each dog that achieves a CKC CAP title.

ATTENTION

It shall be the duty and obligation of the test-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Test Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. **ALL RULES GOVERNING THESE TESTS ARE AVAILABLE ON LINE:**

WHAT IS THE SPRINTER EVENT?

The SPRINTER EVENT was launched by the Canadian Kennel Club on July 1, 2018. The Sprinter is a fun event open to all dogs to enjoy the challenge of running a 100 meter dash. All dogs entered will receive a handicap score based on their height, and their time to finish will be converted to kilometers per hour. Titles are awarded upon the dog accumulating a given number of points.

ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS

SPRINTER EVENT participation is open to all purebred and mixed-breed dogs at least 12 months of age that are:

- individually registered with the CKC, or
- have an Event Registration Number (ERN), or
- have a Performance Event Number (PEN), or
- are eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed, or
- have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) if it's a mixed breed.
- have a Temporary Competition Number (TCN)

NEWVeteran dogs (7yrs old and older on date of the event) See below for new Veteran titles

Sprinter is an athletic pursuit that requires your dog to be in very good condition. **Your dog relies on you to ensure this.**

Females in season may compete, depending on club policy.

If in the opinion of the Test Committee, any entry is found to be lame, unfit to compete or a female in season, it shall not be allowed to compete and the entry fees shall be refunded.

YOUR TEAM

CKC rules state that 'It is recommended that an owner or someone familiar with the dog stand at the finish in order to catch the dog once the course has been completed.' VILCA would like to reinforce this recommendation. Please find a 'buddy catcher' to support your team

EARNING POINTS

The dog's time to complete the 100 meter dash is converted into Kilometers Per Hour (KPH). A handicap system is applied to a dog's KPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers:

- (a) 18" or greater handicap is 1.25.
- (b) 12" up to less than 18" handicap is 1.5.
- (c) Below 12" handicap is 2.0.

Points - KPH multiplied by the dog's handicap. For example 20 KPH x 1.5 = 30 points. Points are rounded to the nearest whole number.

TITLES

There are four titles dogs may earn doing the Sprinter event. They are:

Novice Sprinter (NS) 150 points, Veteran Novice Sprinter (VNS) 75 points

Sprinter (S) 500 points, Veteran Sprinter (VS) 250 points

Advanced Sprinter (AS) 1000 points, Veteran Advanced Sprinter (VAS) 500 points

Sprinter Excellent (SX) 1500 points, Veteran Sprinter Excellent (VSX) 750 points

For each additional 500 (250 for Veterans) points the dog may add a higher number after the SX (SX2, SX3, etc.)

AWARDS

A qualifying ribbon will be awarded to each dog that achieves a score.

A Rosette will be awarded to each dog that achieves a CKC Sprinter title.

COVID 19 PROTOCOLS

The following protocols align with guidelines and orders from the BC Provincial Health Officer at the time this premium list was drafted . Please review these to ensure that you will be able to abide by them before entering the event:

□ A Covid 19 screening questionnaire MAY be at check in and MUST be signed before
you are allowed down at the field. Anyone who identifies as having symptoms, been out of
the country within 14 days, attended a large gathering, testing positive or having been in
proximity with some testing positive will be given a refund and will not be allowed to attend the event.
□ Handlers will receive a refund of entry fees if this event is cancelled due to changes to BC Provincial Health Officers orders or guidelines in effect closer to the event.
□ Cars must be spaced out in the parking area near the field.
□ Social distancing of at least 6' between people not traveling in the same vehicle will be required and enforced. Handlers will not approach volunteers (e.g. timers, photographer, hunt master, paddock master) unless they have a mask on.
□ Handlers of dogs that need to be measured must wear a mask. An agility height card will be acceptable in lieu of measuring.
□ Handlers will check their own bitches for being in season and show the tissue to the inspection team.
□ A volunteer releaser may release your dog, they will sanitize their hands between each dog and wear a mask
□ Handlers need to bring their own hand sanitizers.
□ Handlers must bring their own mask and wear it when social distancing won't work (During briefing, handing dog off to releaser etc)
□ Ribbons may be handed out after each event.
