Looking for something new to do with your dog? How about Urban Tracking? Whether you live in the country or the city, urban tracking is for you!

Although to gain a UTD title you have to pass a TD test first, there is no reason not to introduce your dog to hard surfaces right at the start.

The Nova Scotia German Shepherd Dog Club will be hosting an Urban Tracking (UTD) Seminar on May 30 and 31, and are so pleased and fortunate to have Louise Weaver, CKC Tracking Judge, presenting and sharing her knowledge with us, and with you!



On Saturday, we will meet at Stay n Play in Truro where Louise will review UTD rules and requirements, as well as how a test is structured. The afternoon will be spent working on how to prepare and train your dog toward a CKC UTD title. Louise will also be available on Sunday to do additional outside training with you and your dog.

This exciting seminar is open to anyone interested in learning to track with their dog but those with no previous experience should audit.
