A listing fee must be paid with the entry fee if the dog does not have an individual CKC registration number. The

litter registration number cannot be accepted.

Please note that fees are payable in Canadian funds. Due to fluctuating currency, discounted cheques will not be accepted.

Personal cheques will be accepted, however they are payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" as they will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds.

No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the entry fee.

Tendering of an NSF cheque as payment of entry fees shall be considered to be non-payment of entry fees and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.

Entrants must abide by any errors made in entering their dogs. The Show Secretary will not be responsible for checking the accuracy of entries. Errors should be brought to the attention of the Show Secretary.

The committee reserves the right to refuse entries subject to CKC rules.

The Show Secretary will be unable to accept or cancel entries after the closing date.

Telephone, fax, or any other electronic entries are prohibited except in such circumstances as the CKC Board of Directors may otherwise authorize. (13.4.1 Dog Show Rules)

Every dog entered in a championship show must be registered or eligible for registration in the Stud Book of the CKC

No one shall have any claim or recourse against the organization holding the show/trial or any official connected therewith for the refusal of an entry.

General Information

On the day of the show/trial, the show/trial superintendent will be in complete charge of the show/trial.

After closing of entries, a receipt and judging schedule must be mailed to all exhibitors. Only dogs properly entered in the show/trial will be admitted.

The building will be opened 1 (one) hour before the start of the show/trial.

Dogs may be removed from the building when not required for further judging.

Dogs **must not** be left in the building overnight.

Judging will proceed without any dog not present when called by the ring steward.

The show/trial committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and the exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability, in the event of an accident or other misfortune to either dogs or patrons.

If because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or complete the show/trial, no refund of entry fees will be made.

We regret that trailer hook ups will not be available at the show/trial site.

It shall be the duty and obligation of the show giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities.

The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation. The Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

The show/trial grounds are defined as the confines of Gould's Arena, Main Road, Goulds, NL

The authorities of the shows/trials may decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show/trial building on account of viciousness or disease.

There will be a Veterinarian on call throughout the shows/trials

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB Non-Member Participation Fee (Effective January 1, 2011)

Policy:

Non-member participation fee

- a) An annual fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.
- b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have the option to become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in all awards and titles being cancelled.
- c) All Premium Lists will carry a note stating the fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non members and is not applicable to CKC members.

Information:

- A non member resident in Canada is subject to the fee. Dogs co-owned with a CKC member are exempt.
- There are 2 options for non-members:
- a) Join the CKC
- b) Pay the Non-Member Participation Fee
- Dogs co-owned by two or more individuals; the first person listed in the CKC dog records will be considered the caregiver of the dog and all communication will be sent to this person.
- The fee is a yearly charge based on the calendar year January 01 to December 31 in which the awards, legs, points, titles, etc were achieved. It is not based on the number of dogs or titles or awards earned, and is assessed against the owner(s).
- Non members will receive a letter from CKC Head Office informing them that they have 30 days to join the Club or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee.
- Payment of the Non-Member Participation Fee or becoming a CKC member will protect all awards, points, titles and legs in the calendar year in which they were earned.
- Failure to pay the fee within 30 days of the notice will result in all awards, legs, points, titles being cancelled. Once cancelled the awards, legs, points or titles will be given to the next applicable dog.
- Once cancellation takes place, any subsequent awards, titles, legs etc earned will automatically be cancelled without further notice.
- The Non-Member Participation Fee is applicable starting at the first event in which the dog earns awards, points, titles, legs and is not prorated.
- *Please note that the CKC Membership Application and the Non-Member Participation Fee forms are available on the website under CKC Services and then Forms On-line. If submitting a

Membership Application, please ensure that you also complete the Non-Member Participation Fee form so that we are aware of the dogs involved.

CONFORMATION

Regular official classes at this CKC Championship Show shall be as described below.

JUNIOR PUPPY

Dogs 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show.

SENIOR PUPPY

Dogs 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show.

12 TO 18 MONTHS

Dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

CANADIAN BRED

Dogs born in Canada only. Champions of any country excluded.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR

Dogs owned by and handled in the ring by the breeder. The Handler must be the owner/co-owner and breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog in this class but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN

For all dogs.

SPECIALS ONLY

Dogs which have a recorded CKC Registration number or an Event Registration Number and have attained the required points for Canadian Championship status. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy in Breed, if eligible.

EXHIBITION ONLY

All dogs entered shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as for a dog entered in competition.

OBEDIENCE

Novice A

- <u>9.1.1</u> The obedience Novice Class A shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex which have not earned the title of C.D. (Companion Dog) in Canada or any other country. A dog shall not be entered in a Novice Class once it has been exhibited in an Open Class.
- **9.1.2** Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families, and must be eligible to handle under section 9.1.3.
- **9.1.3** No professional handler or trainer, or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its U.D.
- (Utility Dog) title in Canada or elsewhere shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class. A person who receives a consideration (monetary or otherwise) for handling dogs may not enter this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.
- **9.1.4** A dog which has earned a comparable title in any other country is not eligible for entry in this class, but may be entered in the Novice B Class if it has not earned its C.D. title in Canada.

Novice B

- **9.2.1** The obedience Novice Class B shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex which have not earned the title of C.D. (Companion Dog) in Canada.
- <u>9.2.2</u> Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler who handled each dog in the first 4 exercises must handle each dog in the Sit and Down exercises, except that where a handler has handled more than one dog in the first 4 exercises, he must have an additional handler for each dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises.
- <u>9.2.3</u> No dog may be entered in both the Novice Class A and Novice Class B at any one trial. A dog that has earned the title of C.D., or a comparable title in any other country, but has not earned its title of C.D. in Canada, may only be entered in the Novice Class

Open A

- <u>10.1.1</u> The obedience Open Class A shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex which have earned the title of C.D. (Companion Dog) in Canada but which have not earned the title of C.D.X. (Companion Dog Excellent).
- <u>10.1.2</u> Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families, and must be eligible to handle under section 10.1.3.
- <u>10.1.3</u> No professional handler or trainer, or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its U.D. (Utility Dog) title in Canada or elsewhere shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class. A person who receives a consideration (monetary or otherwise) for handling dogs may not enter this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.
- <u>10.1.4</u> A dog which has earned its C.D.X. title or has earned a comparable title in any other country is not eligible for entry in this class but may only be entered in the Open Class B.

Open B

10.2.1 The obedience Open Class B shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex which

shall have earned the title of C.D. (Companion Dog) in Canada.

- 10.2.2 Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person.
- <u>10.2.3</u> A person may enter more than one dog in this class, but the same handler who handled each dog in the first 5 exercises must handle each dog in the Sit and Down exercises, except that where a handler has handled more than one dog in the first 5 exercises, he must have an additional handler for each additional dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises.
- 10.2.4 No dog may be entered in both Open Class A and Open Class B at any one trial.
- <u>10.2.5</u> A dog that has earned the title of C.D.X. or a comparable title in any other country must compete in Open Class B. Dogs that have completed the requirements for the title of U.D. (Utility Dog) in Canada may enter this class.
- <u>10.2.6</u> A dog eligible for entry in the Utility Class at any obedience trial held under these rules is also eligible for entry in the Open Class B at the same trial

Utility Class

<u>11.1.1</u> The obedience Utility Class shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex which shall have earned the title of C.D.X. (Companion Dog Excellent) in Canada. <u>11.1.2</u> Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. However, the same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

Pre-Novice

- **13.2.1** The Pre-Novice class shall be for dogs of any recognized or listed breed and of either sex which have not earned the title of P.C.D. (Pre-Companion Dog) in Canada.
- <u>13.2.2</u> Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class and must have an additional handler for each dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercise.
- <u>13.2.3</u> A dog may be entered in the Pre-Novice that has not earned the title of C.D. in Canada or a comparable title in any other country. 13.2.4 The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to the Novice Classes.

Exhibition Only

All dogs entered for "Exhibition Only shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as for a dog entered in competition.

A separate entry form is required for each class in an obedience trial. To facilitate setting up jumps for open and utility, please state the jump height requirement on each entry form. A bitch in season may not be entered in an obedience trial. Entry fees will be refunded for a bitch in season provided a veterinarian's certificate to this effect is presented to the show/trial secretary prior to the start of the first trial.

Rally Obedience

Rally Obedience is a form of dog obedience with a twist - a total focus on fun and excitement for the dog, handler and spectator.

Dog and handler teams follow a set course, performing the exercise indicated by 10-20 consecutive signs. Signs are numbered to indicate the course the handler and dog take during the performance.

There is a lot of variety with each rally course. And rally is different than Obedience in that handlers may talk to their dogs, praise them, and give them needed verbal commands.

Handlers can even use hand signals, point and in Novice and Advanced, clap and snap their fingers at anytime and as often as the handler needs. And it's not only allowed, but encouraged making it a really fun sport!

THREE LEVELS OF RALLY OBEDIENCE

The first level – **Rally Novice** (**RN**) – is performed on lead.

At this level there are 31 different exercises from which the judge will select 10-15 for the test. Each exercise is outlined on a sign in graphic and words, and can include various combinations of turns, heeling, sits, downs, fronts and finishes. Points are deducted for tight lead, lack of control, incorrectly performing a station, lack of teamwork and handler error. The use of loud or harsh commands and intimating signals by the handler are also deducted from your points.

The next two levels, **Rally Advanced (RA)** and **Rally Excellent (RE)** are performed off lead and include jumps.

Scoring for all levels is based on a maximum of 100 points with a minimum passing score of 70. Rally Obedience is timed and any tied scores are based on the time taken to run the course. You need three qualifying scores earned under at least two different judges

CHAMPIONSHIP POINT RATINGS

The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated dog-awarded winners shall be:

Dogs competing (including dog awarded winners):

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from their ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

In no case may a dog earn more than 5 (five) points at a single show.

In order for a dog to be recognized as a champion it must win at least 10 points under 3 different judges, which includes at least one 2-point win. This 2-point win must be at the breed or group level.

PUPPY SWEEPSTAKES

Sweepstakes shall be for any dog six months up to and including 18 months of age. To enter this class, the dog must be entered in one of the CKC Regular Classes or Exhibition Only. There will be three classes in all, divided by sex.

<u>JUNIOR CLASS</u> – for dog/bitch at least 6 months of age up to 9 months on the day of the show.

SENIOR CLASS – for dog/bitch at least 9 months of age up to 12 months on the day of the show.

<u>12 – 18 MONTH CLASS</u> – for dog/bitch at least 12 months of age up to 18 months on the day of the show.

The winner of each classes will compete in Best In Sweepstakes. A rosette will be awarded to first, second, third and fourth place in each class, as well as Best In Sweeps, Best of Opposite Sex in Sweeps, Best Puppy In Sweeps.

VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES

Veterans Sweeps shall be for any dog/bitch 7 years of age and up. To enter this class, the dog/bitch must be entered in one of the CKC Regular Classes or Exhibition Only. There will be three classes in all divided by sex.

- 7 9 YEARS for dog/bitch at least 7 years of age and up to 9 years on the day of the show.
- 9 11 YEARS for dog/bitch over 9 years of age and up to 11 years on the day of the show.
- <u>11+ YEARS</u> for dogs/bitch over 11 years on the day of the show.

For both Puppy and Veterans Sweepstakes, the class winners will compete for Best In Sweepstakes and Best Of Opposite Sex with the prize money being distributed as follows:

50% of entry for each sweeps class will go to the winner of each class.

15% of the total entry sweeps will go to Best In Sweeps.

10% of the total sweeps entry will go to the Best of Opposite Sex In Sweeps

25% will be retained for administrative purposes.

Class Structure

Peewee

Children up to 6 years of age. This is a non-competitive class.

Junior Novice

Handlers 6 to 11 years old who have not achieved four first placements in this class.

Junior Open

Handlers 6 to 11 years of age who have achieved four first placements in the Novice class or any handler wishing to enter this level. Once the handler has entered and competed in the Open class, he cannot compete in the Novice class again.

Senior Novice

Handlers 12 to 17 years of age who have not achieved four first placements in this class.

Senior Open

- Handlers 12 to 17 years of age who have received four first placements in the Senior Novice class.
- Handlers who have previously competed in an open class in either junior or senior.
- Handlers who have progressed through the Junior Open class and feel that they have enough experience to compete at the level.
- Handlers (junior or senior) who have received some type of monetary consideration for showing a dog.
- Once a handler competes in the Senior Open class, s/he cannot compete in any other class.

Best overall is optional at the discretion of the host club.

Junior handlers are eligible to compete in the above class structure from their eighth birthday until they reach their eighteenth birthday.
