MOVING UP	Due to Covid-19 CKC Guidelines, move-ups are not permitted at these trials.		
LIMITED ENTRY	OBEDIENCE: Entry in each obedience trial will be limited to the capacity of the judge to judge at the rate of 9 Pre-Novice, 8 Novice and Novice Intermediate, 7 Open, and 6 Utility dogs per hour. A judge may not be assigned more than 7 hours of judging.		
	RALLY: Entry in each rally obedience trial will be limited to the capacity of the judge to judge at the rate of 10 dogs per hour less time for walk-throughs. A judge may not be assigned more than 7 hours of judging.		
	Once a judge has reached his/her capacity, entries for that trial will be closed even if the closing date has not been reached. In the case of the entry limit having been reached, remaining entries will be assigned a position (by class) on a reserve list. Exhibitors will be notified of their position on the reserve list. If the entry of a bitch in season is pulled after entries are closed, it may be substituted with one from the reserve list up to and including the day of the trial. If the entry of another dog is pulled prior to the trial, it may be substituted with one from the reserve list up to 24 hours prior to the trial.		
MIXED & UNRECOGNIZED BREEDS	These trials are open to mixed and unrecognized breeds. In order to compete, mixed and unrecognized breed dogs must have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) from the Canadian Kennel Club and must have a CKC-approved microchip. Mixed-breed dogs must be spayed or neutered.		
	Unrecognized breed dogs do not need to be spayed or neutered. <i>A dog</i> eligible for a CCN may not be entered as a listed dog.

OBEDIENCE TRIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

MASTER

(MOTCH)

OBEDIENCE

TRIAL CHAMPION

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Obedience Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 19.7 of the Obedience Rules and Regulations states: It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer, or competitor at an Obedience Trial held under these regulations, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Obedience Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Section 14.3.1 The CKC will permit the use of the letters MOTCH to be used as a prefix of the name of any dog that has met the requirements for that title as hereinafter provided.

Section 14.3.2 Points for this title may only be accumulated after the completion of the OTCH title.

Section 14.3.3 Points may be accumulated simultaneously with credits toward both the OTCHX and MOTCH titles. However, the MOTCH title will not be awarded until completion of the OTCHX title.

Section 14.3.4 One High in Class placement is required in either of the Open B classes or the Utility B class but no minimum score is required.

Section 14.3.5 A dog must acquire a total of 40 points to earn a MOTCH title. A minimum of 15 points must be obtained from either of the Open B classes and the Utility B class. The remaining 10 points can be obtained from either class.

RALLY OBEDIENCE TRIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

RALLY CHAMPION

(RCH)

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Rally Obedience Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 17.7 of the Rally Obedience Rules and Regulations states: It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor at a rally Obedience Trial held under these regulations, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Section 16.1 The CKC will permit the use of the letters RCH to be used as a prefix of the name of any dog that has met the requirements for that title as hereinafter provided.

Section 16.2 A dog may begin earning points toward the RCH title as soon as the Rally Master (RM) title requirements have been completed.

Section 16.3 The RCH title will be awarded to dogs that have successfully earned a minimum of 100 points total from competing in both the Excellent B and Master classes in the same trial.

- (a) 50 points must come from the Rally Excellent B class, including a minimum of five (5) scores of 95 or higher.
- (b) 50 points must come from the Rally Master class, including a minimum of five (5) scores of 95 or higher.

Section 16.4 A qualifying score must be earned in both the Excellent B class and the Master class in the same trial on five (5) different occasions under at least five (5) different judges

ONTARIO NOVA SCOTIA DUCK TOLLING RETRIEVER CLUB COVID-19 INFORMATION

The Ontario Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club recognizes the impact and risks that COVID-19 continues to have on our community. It is important to ensure the safety of our club members, volunteers, ring stewards, judges and exhibitors. The Ontario Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club will follow all federal, provincial, municipal and facility protocols related to COVID-19. However, public-health guidelines, restrictions and show protocols may change between the posting of this Premium List and the publishing of the Judging Schedule.

By entering our show, you agree to abide by any guidelines or protocols that the Ontario Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club and the Oakville & District Kennel Club have in place at the time the trials are hosted. If any club members, volunteers, ring stewards, judges, or fellow exhibitors are subject to abusive language or behaviour, or if you fail to abide by the show protocols, this may result in your dismissal from the show with no right of entry-fee refund.

Trial Site & Rings

- There will be signs to indicate when you are entering the official show grounds. Entrance will have a screening station.
- There will be hand sanitizing stations located on the show grounds.
- Judges' tables, in-ring grooming tables and other 'touch surfaces' will be sanitized regularly.
- There will be separate entrances and exits for each ring.
- Exhibitors will pick up placement ribbons/prizes as they exit the ring. No recycling of ribbons.
- There will be an official show photographer, and they may have their own COVID protocols.
- No indoor grooming. Grooming only at personal set-ups.

Masks

- Masks are mandatory while in the ring and the show precincts. Masks must be worn completely, covering both mouth and nose.
- If you do not bring a mask, one will be provided for you at a cost (limited supply).
- Face shields, neck warmers, masks with exhalation valves, handkerchiefs and any other loose fitting face coverings are NOT masks.
- Anyone unable to wear a mask due to a medical condition will require a medical exception letter from an authorized health professional. You must be able to show the letter to the Trial Secretary. In this case, the exhibitor would be required to wear a face shield.

Social Distancing

- Maintain at least 2 metres (6 feet) of social distancing while at the show venue. The Ontario Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club is ensuring extra space is provided in the rings and surrounding area so that adequate space is available to socially distance.
- No hugging or handshaking permitted on any of the official grounds of the show.
- Wash hands and use hand sanitizer as frequently as possible.
- Do not touch dogs that are not your own.
- Stay in own set-up, except for ring time, washroom, photos, exercising dog breaks.

Refund Policy

- If the Ontario Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever Club or the Oakville & District Kennel Club is required to cancel the show due to any federal, provincial, municipality or CKC guidelines, policies, or directives, a full refund of all entry fees (less expenses) will be offered.
- All entry-service fees and credit-card fees are non-refundable.
- If you are unable to attend the dog show, for any reason, after entries have closed, refunds will not be provided.
- If you cannot travel to the show due to a government restriction on travel, refunds will not be provided.

From the East

Take Hwy 401 West to London. Merge on to Hwy 403 West toward Q.E.W./Hamilton//Brantford. Exit number 55 called Copetown Road RR-52. At the end of the off ramp turn Left (south). You are now on Trinity Road. The Ancaster Fairgrounds are located on the south-west corner of Wilson Street W. and Trinity Road -one block south of the Hwy exit.

From the West

Take Hwy 401 East to Toronto.

Merge on to Hwy 403 East toward Brantford/Hamilton/Niagara Falls.

Exit number 55 called Copetown Road RR-52.

At the end of the off ramp turn Right (south). You are now on Trinity Road.

The Ancaster Fairgrounds are located on the south-west corner of Wilson Street W. and Trinity Road -one block south of the Hwy exit.

From Buffalo, NY - Peace Bridge
