IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND TEST RULES

ELIGIBILITY: This test is open to all purebred dogs that are eighteen months of age or older on the day of the test. It is also open to mixed breeds and unrecognized breeds who have a (CCN) Canine Companion Number registered with the Canadian Kennel Club. Draft Dog Excellent and Brace Draft Dog entries must have previously earned a D.D. title in order to enter the D.D.X. or B.D.D. titles. Re-qualifications will be accepted only after all untitled entries are included. Re-qualifications shall be judged as the last team in the section for which they are entered. Day of entries will be accepted if space if available. Move ups will be allowed if registered 1 hour prior to commencement of Test 2. Judges may excuse a dog at any time during a test for lack of physical capacity. Bitches in Season will be able to compete, please notify test secretary on day of event. The bitch must be kept away from the test area and will compete after all other dogs have finished.

ENTRY LIMIT: There will be an entry limit 24 Dogs Total in NDD, DD or BDD, DDX, BDDX GROUP EXERCISES: Draft Dog Field Work, Draft Dog Excellent Freight Haul and/or the Draft Dog Excellent Backpacking Exercises may be performed using the Group option as stated in Section 11.2 using the recommended methodology as stated in Appendix A.

CLOSING DATE: November 6, 2024 or when the limit has been reached. Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date. If the limit is reached prior to the closing date, a list of alternates will be kept to fill any vacancies created due to cancellations before the test date. DAY OF TEST ENTRIES will be accepted for this test if limits have not been reached and/or alternates have been accommodated.

ENTRY FEE: \$75.00 (Canadian) per dog or in the case of a brace, per brace entry (payable to the Newfoundland Dog Club of Canada-BC Region) which includes CKC recording fees, Mail entries or deliver entries to the Draft Test Secretary. **PLEASE NOTE:** <u>DO NOT</u> WRITE "Canadian Funds" on US cheques as they are not accepted by Canadian banks. Entry fees must be paid in Canadian funds.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

Every foreign born and owned dog that is entered in a Canadian Kennel Club event must obtain an Event Registration Number (ERN) within 30 days of that event. An Event Registration Number Application must be completed and submitted along with a copy of registration documents from a CKC recognized foreign kennel club and the required fee. PERFORMANCE EVENT NUMBER

A Performance Event Number (PEN) allows an unregisterable dog of a CKC recognized or listed breed to participate in competitive events that are appropriate for the breed. In order for a dog to be eligible to receive a PEN, all of the following criteria must be met:

- 1) The dog must be of a CKC recognized or listed breed
- 2) The dog, for one reason or another, must not be eligible for CKC registration
- 3) The dog must be spayed or neutered
- 4) The dog must be property identified with a CKC approved micropchip (this requirement is not necessary for ILP dogs.)
- 5) In the case of a foreign born dog residing in the USA, in addition to the above, the dog must have been issued an AKC PAL number.

CANINE COMPANION NUMBER (For Mixed or Unrecognized Breed Entries)

Amendments have been made to the Draft Dog Test Rules so that mixed or unrecognized breed dogs are permitted to participate. A Canine Companion Number allows these dogs to participate and earn Draft titles. The Canine Companion Number (CCN) must be applied for **PRIOR** to entry and included on the entry form. TEMPORARY COMPETITION NUMBER

All owners of unregistered, CKC-recognized breeds entering events are required to obtain a Temporary Competition Number (TCN). TCNs allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while pursuing permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN) if foreign.

All unregistered recognized breeds must obtain a TCN before entering an event. While there is no fee to obtain a TCN, exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called listing fees) when entering events using this number. The process of obtaining a TCN is self-serve; exhibitors are directed to the CKC website http://www.ckc.ca to complete an online application and a TCN will be issued instantly upon completion. Only 1 TCN is required for each dog and must be used for all event entries until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN. You do not need to be a CKC member to apply for a TCN.

ENTRIES: Entries must be complete, signed and submitted on the official CKC entry form. All entries should be forwarded to the Draft Test Secretary:

CONFIRMATION OF ENTRY: After the closing date, all entrants will be notified by mail and/or telephone or email of their placement.

EQUIPMENT: Each entrant is to supply their own equipment. The freight load will be supplied by the test committee.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

This test will accept entries on a first come, first serve basis. Day of entries will be accepted if test does not fill.

Exhibitors must clean up after their dogs and exercise them only in designated areas. We appreciate your cooperation.

The Draft Test Committee will exercise due care and diligence for the welfare of all the dogs entered but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of an accident or other misfortune to any dog, exhibitor, either to themselves or their property. Complete information regarding this test will be sent out with the entry acknowledgments. If you require specific information please contact the Test Secretary.

AWARDS & PRIZES: All participating entrants will receive a ring favour and each dog earning a qualifying score will receive a rosette. This is a 3 judge test. Those dogs with qualifying scores from all 3 judges will receive the appropriate Novice Draft Dog, Draft Dog, Brace Draft Dog, Draft Dog Excellent or Brace Draft Dog Excellent Titles.

IT SHALL BE THE DUTY AND OBLIGATION of the test-giving club to see that a judge, club official, steward, volunteer or competitor at a Draft Dog test is not subject to indignities. The Draft Test Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.
