GENERAL INFORMATION

The Canadian Australian Shepherd Association will abide by any regulations as required by Provincial Health Authorities, Town of Lunenburg & CKC at the time of the show. Limited Indoor set-up space. Set-up outside may be required based on space. Arena is open to the public. Let's continue to have fun.

- 1. The building will be open at 7 a.m. with judging commencing at 8 a.m. Friday set-up is from 5-7 p.m.
- 2. Only dogs entered in the Shows and Trials will be allowed in the building.
- 3. JUNIOR HANDLING: Conformation. On Saturday, in Ring 1 following BIS for show 1. Dogs competing in Junior Handling must be entered in one of the Official Classes or in Exhibition Only. Registration with the Show Secretary, 10:00 to 11:00 a.m. Fee: \$2.00
- 4. Dogs will not be allowed in the building overnight.
- 5. Judging will proceed without any dog that is not present when called by the Ring Steward. Handlers and exhibitors with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers should judging times conflict.
- 6. The Superintendent will be in full charge of the Shows and Trials. To accommodate ALL exhibitors, the CNASA reserves the right to limit set-up space, size, and location of crates. Use of Ex-pens is not permitted. Your co-operation is greatly appreciated.
- 7. The CNASA will use all due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume liability in the event of, an accident or any misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, or patrons and will not be responsible for equipment left on premises.
- 8. The CNASA greatly appreciates your co-operation in cleaning up after your dogs.
- 9. Section 19.7 Dog Show Rules: It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know the rules pertaining to these events. A copy of these Rules is available from the Canadian Kennel Club.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS FROM THE CKC - HEALTH REMINDERS

This notice is to provide clubs with a reminder regarding the health of the dogs on the premises of events. No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- 1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.
- 2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
- 3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.
