It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue. (CKC Conformation Rules & Regulations 19.7)

It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor at an obedience or rally trial held under these regulations is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Trial Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue. (CKC Obedience Rules & Regulations 20.7)

No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action. (CKC Conformation Rules & Regulations 4.1.5)

Online entries, Credit Card & eTransfer payments are accepted only through The Entry Line. The American Cocker Spaniel Club of Canada does not accept credit cards for payment. The Entry Line is the only authorized online entry service for these events.

Important Note Regarding Emails & Faxes: It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that any electronic submission, either email, facsimile, or any document transmitted electronically, reaches the proper authority or recipient, within the times and limits as regulated for each document in the CKC Rules and Regulation. Sent fax receipts, and/or , copies of sent emails, will not be taken as evidence of receipt by recipients.

REFUND POLICY - COVID & OTHERWISE: If, due to Covid, these Shows are not able to be held: refunds will be issued to exhibitors - MINUS any costs incurred by the ACSCC. Entry Line WILL NOT REFUND SERVICE FEES. If because of an act of God, riot or civil disobedience, extreme weather event, governmental orders, regulations or decree (other than Covid related), or other acts or circumstances beyond the control of the ACSCC or HKC, it is impossible to open or complete the Shows, no refund of entry fees will be made.

REFUND INFORMATION ~ COMMUNICABLE DISEASES

Entry Fees will be refunded for dogs/bitches that are posing a threat of a COMMUNICABLE DISEASE on the day of the show. To obtain the refund, a letter from a practicing Veterinarian MUST be presented to the Show Secretary prior to the commencement of the show.

Attention Foreign Exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor.

Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge you to purchase a bank draft or money order in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

Junior Handling - American Cocker Spaniel Judge: Peter Drake

Junior handling will be held after all judging in Best of Specialty has been completed. All classes will be offered. American Cocker Spaniels competing in junior handling must be entered in the Specialty in one of the regular classes, non-regular classes or in exhibition only. To sign up to participate, please do so, at the Show Secretary's table prior to 11:00 am.

Photographer

Official Show Photographer will be Oslach Photography, Ammon, NB (506) 204-8355. No other photographers may take official photographs or photos for resale within the Show precincts unless by special arrangement with the show photographer and the show committee.

Rules

A copy of the rules pertaining to Conformation Shows or Obedience Trials & Rally-Obedience Trials may be obtained from the Canadian Kennel Club. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know the rules pertaining to these events.

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) - Effective January 1, 2023

Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN). **Listed Breeds that do not yet have a Miscellaneous Class Number (MCN) number will be eligible to apply for a TCN.**

There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN.

TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly. Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone for a number.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an Events Registration Number (ERN) from the Canadian Kennel Club. **Effective January 1, 2023, the policy has been changed to allow Listed Breeds registered with a different Canadian registry to also apply for an ERN. Canadian Born dogs that are registrable by a breed association in Canada recognized by Agriculture Canada may obtain an ERN.**

To obtain an ERN simply do the following:

1. Send a photocopy of the dog's registration certificate reflecting current ownership to CKC, for example AKC Registration Certificate with a written request for an ERN.
2. Include with the above a cheque or money order in the amount currently required payable to the Canadian Kennel Club.
3. Ensure that you provide your full return address to enable the ERN to be sent to you.
4. Faxed requests will be accepted. Please indicated your Visa/MasterCard number expiry date, cardholders name and signature.

This Event Registration Number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Dogs may be entered as "LISTED", however, failure to apply for an ERN within 30 days will result in cancellation of any wins, awards or scores. Please forward your request to:

ATTENTION ALL CANADIANS WHO ARE NOT CKC MEMBERS

Effective January 1, 2011, the CKC has instituted an annual Non-Member Participation Fee for awards and titles for a CANADIAN non-member of the CKC. These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by a resident of Canada who is not a member of the CKC; it is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. (For a Membership application, please go to www.ckc.ca under CKC Services and Forms On-Line.) The Non-Member Participation Fee is fee paid in the calendar year (January – December) in which the dog achieved its title and/or titles.

Best of Opposite Sex will be awarded a Rosette and 20% of all Sweepstakes entry money.

First-place winners in each class will divide the remaining 30% of the total entry fees.

The club (ACSCC) will retail 25% of the total entry fees for administration.

Rosettes will be offered for 1st to 4th in each class.

Award of Merit: At the Judge's discretion, Award of Merit may be awarded up to one (1) Award for every ten (10) dogs competing for Best of Breed, which will be presented following Best of Breed judging.

Obedience: A prize will be awarded to all American Cocker Spaniels earning a Qualifying Scores in Trial 1 on Saturday September 2, 2023. A prize will be awarded to the American Cocker Spaniel earning the Top Obedience score in Trial 1 on Saturday September 2, 2023.

Rally-Obedience: A prize will be awarded to all Qualifying Scores earned by an American Cocker Spaniel in Trial 1 on Saturday September 2, 2023.

ENTRY INFORMATION

1. All entries are to be sent to the Show Secretary and must be received on or before the closing date and time. Official CKC Entry Forms MUST be used. Please PRINT OR TYPE YOUR ENTRIES. Remember your entry can only be as accurate as the information you provide. The Show Secretary is NOT RESPONSIBLE for incorrect information provided by the entrant. Moving class dogs to specials is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.
2. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by proper entry fees and forms.
3. Incomplete entries will be returned. Agents and Handlers please note that full name and address of owners must be filled in.
4. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom entries were made.
5. To comply with CKC regulations, we will be unable to accept or substitute any entry reaching the show/trials Secretary after the closing date and time.
6. Only a dog individually registered, or eligible to be registered, in the stud book of the CKC may compete in these shows. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules.
7. All entry confirmations and Judging Schedules will be sent as soon as possible after entries close.
8. It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO VERIFY the receipt of any electronic entries prior to the advertised closing date. A valid means of payment must accompany all entries.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The American Cocker Spaniel Club of Canada and the Halifax Kennel Club will use all due care and diligence for the safety and welfare of the dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible in the event of an accident to dogs or exhibitors.
2. The Superintendent will be in complete charge of these Shows.
3. Neither the American Cocker Spaniel Club of Canada nor the Halifax Kennel Club will not be responsible for any equipment left on the show premises.
4. No Public Catalogue will be available. Know your numbers when picking up armbands.
5. Please Do Not leave personal belongings at ringside.
6. Please Do Not leave masks, gloves, water bottles, litter, etc behind. Dispose of these items in the garbage bins provided.
7. Please Clean Up after your dogs.

SHOW & TRIAL PRECINCTS - The precincts of these shows and trials will be the building and its entrances.

RULES AND GUIDELINES TO FOLLOW WHILE AT THE SPORTSPLEX

- No Ex-Pens are permitted
- There is to be NO food brought in or consumed within the show premises. All that is allowed in is bottled water.
- It is suggested that all crates have a waterproof covering eg tarpaulin under them. It would go a long way to show our respect for the venue.
- Please exercise your dogs frequently to avoid accidents in the building.
- Bait is permitted but must not be thrown in the rings. This will be strictly enforced.
- For those with a large amount of gear to unload please use the large double doors that are around the back of the building. It will make your job easier.

DOG HEALTH REMINDERS

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
- Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event); Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.
- Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

DIRECTIONS

From Halifax : Take NS-102 to Exit 8A . At the round about, take the first exit, drive to NS Hwy 2, At the roundabout take the first exit. Drive to East Hants Sportsplex 1076 Hwy 2 (on your right)

From New Brunswick or Cape Breton: Take NS-104 to exit 15 (Only exit to Halifax). Take NS-102 to Exit 8A. At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit. At the 2nd roundabout, take the first exit, drive to NS Hwy 2 At the roundabout take the first exit. Drive to East Hants Sportsplex 1076 Hwy 2 (on your right)

Baby Puppy	A dog 4 months up to 6 months on the day of the show
Junior Puppy	A dog 6 months up to 9 months on the day of the show
Senior Puppy	A dog between 9 months and up to 12 months on the day of the show
12-18 Months	A dog between 12 months and up to 18 months on the day of the show
Canadian Bred	A dog which was born in Canada
Bred by Exhibitor	A dog owned and handled by the breeder
Field Dog	A dog must have attained a title or placement in a field trial or test. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.
Open Class	A dog 6 months of age or older
Specials Only	Dogs who are Canadian Champions
Exhibition Only	Dogs 6 months and over, not in competition.
Veteran Class Dogs	Must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.
Altered class	For sexually altered dogs only

NOTE: 4–6-month Exhibition only puppy~ if the puppy does not yet have a CKC Registration Number the Listing Fee is waived.

CHAMPIONS & CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 1: A dog awarded WINNERS at a championship show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder.

SECTION 2: The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs Competing:	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded WINNERS

To determine the numbers of championship points earned by a dog awarded WINNERS total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. The new system provides for additional points (provided that the dog has defeated another as listed hereunder):

A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five (5) points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at any single show.

Grand Champions and GCH Points

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. 15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch).

The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GRAND CHAMPION EXCELLENT AND GCHEX POINTS The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

a) One (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed). b) Three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.

c) A CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, three (3) Group wins, or three (3) Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1,2022.
